St. Francis House Summer Support

WE BEGAN first at CSS as the St. Francis House Food Pantry. In the beginning, Holy Family Parish began to distribute food to the hungry in our community. That was nearly 50 years ago, and still our St. Francis House Food Pantry is very busy, serving on average 115 families everyday, distributing more than 600,000 pounds of food every year. St. Francis House is the largest food pantry in the state and clients run the gamut from seniors on fixed incomes to working families struggling to make ends meet. We ask our clients what other expenses they have to cover that make it difficult to afford buying food, and we hear rent, utilities, and medical bills. Most of our clients have jobs or are retired, and need a helping hand. CSS and the larger community of Anchorage, are here to help. We are open Monday through Thursday from 9 AM to 1 PM, and the last Wednesday of every month from 4 PM to 6:30 PM.

Our pantry is stocked with food items mostly bought at a reduced rate in partnership with the Food Bank of Alaska or with business partners in town. We also receive federal support for specific programs and generous donations from local parishes, organizations and individuals to supplement what we purchase. These donations allow for healthy and fresh food choices. St. Francis House Food Pantry is staffed by three people, and relies on numerous and amazing volunteers to serve the large number of people whom we help. Volunteers stock items, as well as serve as personal shoppers for our clients.

In addition, we have students from ASD's ACE/ACT program working in St. Francis House to acquire life and work skills. St. Francis House is truly an example of the community working together.

We can demonstrate great success, but still we face the question that we have faced since the beginning:

"Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?"
John 6:5

Food security is an issue that we have been dealing with throughout history. Thinking about the story of the loaves and fishes brings to mind how St. Francis House makes small miracles happen every day --in partnership with all of you in Anchorage-- to have enough food to support those in need. Every day, in every season of the year, there are hungry people in our community. By all of us coming together and joining our resources, we can feed our community.

Summer food service programs are available to youth age 18 and younger throughout Anchorage. If you'd like more information about those programs or St. Francis House Food Pantry, or if you would like a tour, please go to www.cssalaska.org.

PATHWAYS *to* INDEPENDENCE

Linda came to Alaska from Florida eleven years ago after leaving an abusive marriage.

With limited funds, food was scarce so a friend told Linda about the resources at the St. Francis Food Pantry. Linda used the food provided by St. Francis House to survive.

With times tough, Linda says she became a victim of depression. A doctor advised her do some volunteer work.

Linda says that St. Francis House Food Pantry was an easy choice because without the Catholic Social Services


program, she would not have made it.

She has been volunteering since Jan 2015 and it's helped her immensely.

Linda says she is able to help inspire other clients that there is hope and that someone cares about them.

One day a single mom came in who couldn't afford a birthday cake for her child.

Linda was able to find a donated cake to go along with the emergency food and she says the mother and the child were overwhelmed with happiness.



We are very happy to say that the Walmart Foundation will donate \$40,000 to Saint Francis House Food Pantry. Walmart funds will be used to supplement the generous donations already received at the food pantry and replace the food items in jeopardy due to funding cuts, which are always looming. This funding will purchase—at a reduced rate—basic nutritious foods such as fresh produce, meat and dairy products.

Food assistance from St. Francis House provides a critical safety net for families living on the edge of or in poverty. This year 93% of our clients report that by receiving food, it allowed them to pay a bill that would have otherwise gone unpaid. Our food assistance alleviates that difficult decision of whether to pay the rent or buy food.

Each year approximately 15,000 low-income Anchorage-area residents receive nutritious food from St. Francis House Food Pantry to bridge the food insecurity gap.
