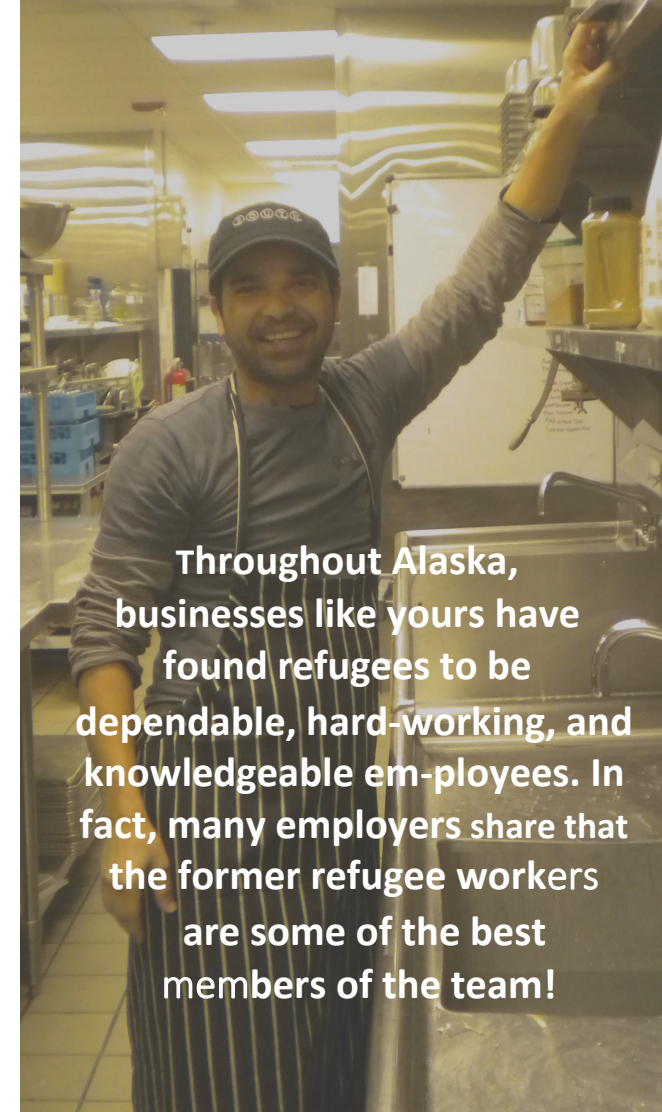

Benefits of Hiring a Refugee

Legally authorized to work in the US

Refugees are fully authorized to work here immediately, and their authorization will never expire.

Skills and experience

Refugees arrive with many useful skills from their previous education or employment, and also have many years of work ahead of them. RAIS clients bring experience in construction, education, agriculture, hospitality, customer service, IT, manufacturing, food service, and many other industries.

Strong work ethic

Having lost their homes, personal property, and careers in their home country, refugees arrive to the US motivated to work and learn. They have a strong desire to regain self-sufficiency and economic stability for their families, as well as give back to the communities that they have resettled in.

Promotes Community

Hiring refugees helps them get off of public assistance and onto the road to self-sufficiency, strengthening families and the community. Refugees pay taxes immediately when they start working, which helps them contribute to the larger economy.

Tax incentives

You business could qualify for certain tax credits and incentives when you employ those receiving public assistance.
