Vibrant Neighborhoods

- 1. Housing Security: Create a more accessible housing environment
 - Promote supportive housing initiatives and increase access to rental vouchers.
- **2.** Food Security: Create a more resilient food support network
 - Continue expanding access to food assistance through Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP).
 - Advocate for continued senior nutrition and The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) through USDA funding.
- 3. Transportation: Provide accessible transportation for all people
 - Promote the importance of buses, bike lanes, and clear sidewalks.

Strong Communities

- 1. Equity: Address historical disadvantages
 - Advocate for local language resources.
- 2. Welcoming Community: Make Anchorage a safe and supportive environment for all
 - Promote Welcoming Anchorage and further opportunities for the public to build relationships with the refugee and immigrant community.
 - Advocate for legislation that removes barriers to employment.
 - Advocate for clear pathways to citizenship for new arrivals.



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Comprehensive Healthcare and Social Services

- 1. Healthcare (physical): Ensure access to affordable treatment and aftercare
 - Support legislation that improves healthcare access for at-risk populations.
- 2. Healthcare (mental): Ensure access to affordable treatment
 - Support public investment in substance use disorder treatment.
- **3.** Social Services: Expand avenues helping clients exit crisis and address life challenges
 - Advocate for a multi-faceted homelessness response network including safety net services and access to healthcare, treatment, and supportive housing resources.

Resilient Families

- 1. Economic Assistance: Keep families from falling into crisis
 - Advocate for well-funded and robust Basic Homeless Assistance Program (BHAP) and Beneficiary and Special Needs Housing Grant (SNHG) programs.

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
