*The mission of Catholic Social Services is to promote the physical, spiritual and mental welfare of persons in need in the community. Through our work, we aim to transition adults and families to permanent stability. During Fiscal Year 2025, Catholic Social Services operated many multi-faceted programs, including emergency shelters, a food pantry, behavioral health services, case management, services for individuals with disabilities, a refugee resettlement and immigration program, Veteran's services, and more.*

**Catholic Social Services served a total of 17,122 people in Fiscal Year 2025.**

*2,272 guests stayed in one of our shelters | 396 individuals were housed through our case management programs*

## 3rd Avenue Resource & Navigation Center

**3,668**

people were served at 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue Resource & Navigation Center.

3rd Avenue Resource & Navigation Center is a place for adults experiencing homelessness to access a full range of services, from short-term needs to long-term engagement. In FY25, 1,823 guests accessed navigation services.

## Behavioral Health Services

Behavioral Health Services provides coordinated mental health services for adults. This new program opened in March 2023 and is an option for clients to engage in Behavioral Health Services, such as behavioral health assessments and individual psychotherapy.

## Brother Francis Shelter

**799**

guests were served at Brother Francis Shelter.

Brother Francis Shelter provides emergency shelter to adults experiencing homelessness, providing access to meals, showers, and medical care, and the Medical Respite program. During FY25, 101 guests stayed in Medical Respite, and 96,104 meals were served.

## Clare House

Clare House provides emergency shelter, case management, and access to behavioral health services to women with children and expectant mothers. Each day of the year, volunteers provided home-cooked meals for the guests at Clare House, totaling 92,301 meals in FY25. 64% of shelter guests were children.

## Complex Care

**301**  
elderly and medically fragile guests sheltered at Complex Care.

Complex Care provides support for the elderly and individuals with complex medical conditions experiencing homelessness and offers safe shelter, case management, and more. During FY25, Complex Care provided 27,922 nights of stay and 45,496 meals to guests.

## Family Disability Services

Family Disability Services (FDS) provides services for both children and adults with developmental disabilities, as well as offering a support system for their families.

## Refugee Assistance & Immigration Services

**1,280**  
clients were served in Alaska by RAIS.

Refugee Assistance & Immigration Services (RAIS) provides a bridge for refugees from their former lives to their new ones in the U.S. RAIS operates as Alaska's primary refugee resettlement agency and has helped a historical number of refugees. In FY25, RAIS welcomed 283 new arrivals.

## St. Francis House Food Pantry

The St. Francis House Food Pantry is one of the largest food pantries in Alaska, providing hundreds of families each month with an emergency supply of food at no cost to the client. During FY25, St. Francis House provided food to 4,775 households, distributing over 767,978 pounds of donated food.

## Supportive Services for Veteran Families

clients were served in Alaska by SSVF.

Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) is a case management program for Veterans and their families experiencing homelessness or at-risk of homelessness. During FY25, SSVF helped house 178 individuals.
